# Labyrinth Workshop

"...a kind of homecoming

Friday 1st April 2011, 9.30am-3.30pm, Scargill House, North Yorkshire

The workshop '...a kind of homecoming' is an exploration of the labyrinth as a place for deepening our awareness of our self and the other.

Through contemplative stillness and movement there will be chance to experience what the labyrinth offers us as 'spiritual beings on a human journey'. There will be time for walking the labyrinth, for personal reflection and for sharing within small groups and the larger gathering.

The **Workshop** will begin at 9.30am with registration and coffee and finish at 3.30pm.

The day is organised by **Veriditas**, a non-profit organization in the USA specialising in this field and led by the **Rev. Di Williams** who is their UK Master Teacher.

### **Registration Fee**

The registration fee is \$120.00 (£75.00) (\$100.00 (£65) if booked before 31st January 2011). This includes lunch and refreshments during the workshop. Payment for this event is only available by credit/debit card via the Veriditas website. www.veriditas.org

It will be limited to 20 people. Rev. Di Williams is an Anglican priest, adult educator, professional massage practitioner, spiritual accompanier and writer. She leads retreats, workshops, labyrinth facilitator training and is a consultant to emerging labyrinth projects in the UK. In 2008 she was awarded the MBE for services to Higher Education, including her multi-faith and labyrinth work.

## **Labyrinth Facilitator Training**

Veriditas Facilitator Training remains the most rigorous and comprehensive training offered. This will be a practical training for those wanting to deepen their own knowledge and understanding of the labyrinth and for those who wish to become a Veriditas Certified Labyrinth Facilitator in order to facilitate the labyrinth well for others.

- Participants will gather for afternoon tea and registration on Friday 1st April at 4.00pm, followed by supper at 6.30pm. The training will begin at 8.00pm with an evening labyrinth walk.
- Sessions on Saturday 2nd will begin after breakfast at 9.30am and continue to 5.30pm. There will be a break for refreshments at 11.00am, lunch at 1.00pm and afternoon tea at 4.00pm. Supper at 6.30pm will be followed by an evening session at 8.00pm.
- On Sunday 3rd training will begin at 9.30am and finish with afternoon tea at 3.00pm. Morning break and lunch are as Saturday.
